#### 2016 President's Report

This last year has been has seen intensive work completed behind the scenes in the development of the new web site and re casting the financial statements for 2015 due to coding errors. This required also the preparation of a special report of the 2015 financial statements that was duly audited by PKF Accountants.

In this context I am delighted to report that with the appointment of our new Treasurer Jennifer Dallinger in October the comprehensive overhaul of the accounts is complete and that all the necessary checks and balances have been instituted in the day to operation of the accounts.

A highlight of the year was the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner in June with Deborah Hutton as the Guest of Honour. Deborah was most generous in accepting our invitation and energetically gave her story of why she loved golf and interviewed the panel of professional and amateur golfers. They were Ann Wilson, Libby Zidar, Anne Alletson-Brown and Alison Woodhouse who all represented our high achievers in golf. Nicole Dyer from ABC radio 91.7 Morning show interviewed Rachel Hetherington earlier in the evening and junior player representatives Robyn Choi and Lisa Edgar. Betty Veivers also gave amusing recollections of her golf experiences and learning how to become a golfer. I sincerely thank Christine Brierley and her team for all the hard work involved in making the night the huge success that it was, with special mention to Viv Ashton and her group of volunteers from Southport Golf Club for making the room look so magical.



An important goal in our strategic plan for 2016 has been to build stronger relationships with the clubs and to target communications more effectively with our constituents. This has been achieved through direct emails with Councillors and

Captains and use of the WGGC Facebook site as well as members of the Management Committee playing in club open days.

Our Facebook site currently has 235 members while the WGGC website now has quickly grown to almost 300 women registered. This ensures that WGGC event information is quickly disseminated to our district golfers and it is evident from the feedback received that our members are now more connected with District events and appreciate the communication. While participation has significantly increased in District events there is still a way to go and to that end I will have a special announcement to make at the AGM regarding a new partnership, which should encourage our members further.

While the Strategic plan will be reviewed for 2017 and priorities re-established it is pleasing to report that the WGGC has already fulfilled a number of goals and responded to key objectives in just one year of the plan, which is for 2016-2019.

Pam Ford, Junior Coordinator with Jan Edgar has been reconnecting with the junior players, their coaches and parents, and has resulted in reactivating the development network. This is critical as some of our better known and successful juniors move on to women's events. 2017 will see the addition of a former junior player, Aroha Wezner from RACV Royal Pines Resort, also assisting with some of the junior events.

The Veterans events have continued their popularity under the enthusiastic management of Tamara Dunn the Chair of Vets ably assisted by Christine Brierley, Viv Ashton and Di Gidney. We will all miss Tamara's smiling face at the Vets events but warmly welcome Karen Holt to this position for 2017. The new lease of life that Tamara and her team have breathed into Vets has been evident by most events being quickly booked out within 24 hours of registration opening. Special thanks goes to Robbie Brown as the major sponsor of the Veteran events in 2016 with their most generous supply of Robbie Brown apparel to the winners in each event.

As Chair of Match I was been fortunate to have both Anne Morpeth and Karen Holt assisting me during the year and while Karen is moving to the Management Committee I welcome Yvonne Mallory to the sub committee for 2017. Anne is taking on the vital role of organising the Meg Nunn trials and selections while Yvonne will be handling a couple of events when I will be away during the year.

It is vitally important that we have volunteers on these sub committees as it greatly helps the Chair/Coordinator with some of the workload. We certainly try to keep them engaged in as fun and friendly way as possible and hope that, like Karen, some of them will endeavour to join the Management Committee at some point in the future.

The website work continues and I have been learning 'Joomla' the language of the website and coming to grips with how information is placed on the site. The development of the registration and payment processes has taken up considerable

time but has been worth every moment as I see how easy the process has been and the time it saves our Committee in trying to match up payments with entry forms.

Finally, I want to thank all of the Management Committee, the Councillors who volunteer their time to act on behalf of their clubs and all of the Women's Committees and Club Management that help to keep WGGC events happening. It is very heartening that you are all passionate about our great game of golf and the camaraderie and fellowship that comes with our events. This is something I hope we will continue to build on even more for the future.

#### **2016 MATCH REPORT**

It has been another busy year with District events in 2016 and Women's Golf Gold Coast is very appreciative of the generous support of the Clubs in allowing us to use their courses and having them in championship condition for the District events.

#### Business Women's Pennant - 12 February to 9 April

This was the first year for the Business Women's Matchplay to be back under the umbrella of WGGC and was a great success with a total of 8 clubs putting forward a team. With the new scoring system the final round and Royal Pines saw potentially 3 clubs that could have won but Southport hung in to defeat Coolangatta Tweed 3 games to 2 gaining 6 points to be the outright winners on 48 points over Royal Pines on 45 and Coolangatta Tweed on 44 points.

#### Inter District Gold Coast vs. Downs and South West - 1 March

The first round was played at Warwick with both teams having 2 wins, 2 losses & 1 half. The 2nd round was played at Emerald Lakes Golf Club and resulted in a resounding win for our Junior and Senior teams with both winning 8 points to 4.

#### District Foursomes - 20 April

Being our 40th Anniversary year I shared a little bit of the history of the Foursomes, noting that it was first won in 1976 by J. Howe & J. Irvine - who also won in 1977, 78 & 80. In 1979 Anne Alletson & Meg Nunn won it. The Division 2 trophy was first played for in 1998 and was won by L. Scott & C. McCarthy. This year was the first year that we have had a Division 3 trophy and hopefully this will continue into the future. Congratulations to all the winners.

#### Mid Week Pennant - 11 July to 29 August.

The Pennant Workshops were very successful, both with attendance and discussion. With Lakelands pulling out at the last minute we decided to have a District team made up of players from clubs that couldn't field a team or players who didn't fit into their clubs teams due to handicaps being too low or too high. The presentation of pennant flags to the winning teams was made at the Council and Captain's meeting in October. As discussed at the Captains meeting there will again be some tweaking to the competition for 2017.

#### Business Women's Championship and Junior Championship – 7 August

The championships were held in brilliant sunshine at Southport Golf Club with 55 entries. The Junior field was particularly strong with Division One having a handicap of 0-4. Additionally three sets of sisters were participating with the Edgar, Kim and Taylor sisters.

The Business Women's Championship was won by Jan Edgar (Burleigh) on a count back from Sue Regusson (Coolangatta Tweed), which is the first time that a Burleigh golfer has won this championship. Trudi Cox (Coolangatta Tweed) won the Business Women's Division Two

Championship, which maintains a strong tradition of Coolangatta Tweed being in the winning circle.

Madeline Trew (Murwillumbah) successfully defended her Junior title from last year and had the best gross score of 74 on the day of competition. Grace Williams was awarded the Allison Chell Trophy with the best nett overall in the Junior competition and Carolin Gress (Lakelands) was the Division 2 Gross Winner.

#### Meg Nunn Salver Inter district match play – 5 to 8 September

Our result for the Meg Nunn was certainly not what we had hoped for, albeit not for lack of preparation. I know our team tried their absolute best each day and they were a very tight knit group but they found the opposition and the course just a bit too difficult. The teams that did the best at Kingaroy were made up of players comfortable on this type of course and the winning team — Central Coast & Central Highlands — had their first win in 20 years, so congratulations to them. We are always looking at ways to improve both the selection process and the training and I can assure you that the Match Committee is working on a new formula that will encompass a player's form over the 12 months prior to the tournament and some new training sessions.

#### Sir Bruce Small Jubilee Trophy – 24 October (rain delayed from 6 June)

This prestigious interclub event was finally played at Coolangatta Tweed Heads Golf Club. The Clubs competing this year were Arundel Hills, Boomerang Farm, Burleigh, Canungra, Club Banora, Coolangatta Tweed Heads, Emerald Lakes, Helensvale, Links Hope Island, Murwillumbah, Parkwood, Sanctuary Cove, Southport and Surfers Paradise. Emerald Lakes were the runaway winners with a nett total of 296, followed by Southport in 2<sup>nd</sup> place with 312 and Helensvale in 3<sup>rd</sup> place with 315.

#### District Championships with Champion of Champions – 7 and 14 November

Needless to say, I'm not planning on running these 2 events in conjunction again — it was way too much work and difficult to cope with. Apart from that, I think everyone enjoyed the day and congratulations to all the winners, especially our District Champion, Isabelle Taylor (SC), our Champion of Champions, Georgia Clarke (SC), our Veteran Champion, Margie Hay (SC) and our Captains Trophy winner, Di Gidney (EL).

#### **2016 VETERANS REPORT**

What an impressive year for the Veterans program in 2016. Six games were held which included for the first time a 'walking only' and charity day event.

The WGGC would like to thank Kay Brown & Pam Robbie from **RobbieBrown** for being our major sponsor again in 2016 - Robbie Brown specialise in Golf and Leisurewear for women sizes 8 to 24. Kay & Pam have donated the prize for our winning team of each event for the last two years.

I urge our members who are on committees of their own clubs to think of RobbieBrown when looking for club pennant shirts etc. The girls have a great website and have new ranges coming through all the time.

Our first event for the year was held at Palmer Gold Coast on the 21<sup>st</sup> March with a field of 128 ladies playing a Texas Stableford at \$75.00 per player it was good value for money and a most successful day.

WGGC introduced an extra game that was promoted as a 'walking event' in our calendar and it was held at Southport Golf Club on the 4<sup>th</sup> April. It was fabulous turnout with 100 Ladies playing a Texas Stableford at a cost of \$40.00 per player (without cart) and was regarded as excellent value.

The event was also a fund raiser for the Cure for Brain Cancer Foundation in which 'Get Free' card packs were sold for \$5.00 each which allowed the purchaser to use a card or ribbon for relief of bunkers, water or unplayable's, these sold out very quickly! A total of \$1200.00 was raised during the day for the charity, which was absolutely amazing!!!

Lakelands Golf day is always a success with 132 ladies partaking in the day's event on 9<sup>th</sup> May. An Irish Four Ball was reintroduced and this change was accepted overwhelmingly. The food and venue is always of a high standard and always a pleasure to return. This is the only event on our calendar where the WGGC do not charge a surcharge of \$5.00 per player, as this allowed us to keep the cost down. Fees were \$30.00 (for Lakeland Members) & \$75.00 (for the rest of the field) per player. This event was the start of the 'rush to enter' from our members with the event at capacity level within 6 days.

From the Lakeland's experience it was introduced at the next Committee meeting unanimously that the Chair of Vet's would cap clubs to register in the first week to 32 players only, the following week if vacancies were available then that club could enter more players. Changes were also made to the time frame of 4 weeks instead of 6 weeks for when the nominations for an event would open on the website due the pace of the events reaching capacity.

Our fourth game of the year was held at Links Hope Island on the 4<sup>th</sup> July with a 4 Ball Aggregate Stableford game played to a massive field of 160 players. The fee per LHI Member was \$30.00 and \$75.00 (for the rest of the field) per player for the game of golf with a cart and a two-course lunch. What great value!!! A big thank you goes to Clare Kirby for locking in that price with the powers to be.

The LHI event sold out in less than 24 hours!!!! Due to the high numbers in the field the WGGC had to pay for 2 additional carts to be brought to the LHI course and an American theme trivia quiz was also introduced on the day to ease the waiting time in slow play. The winners of the trivia won a hamper pack of hotdogs, hotdog bread rolls and American mustard. The day was amazing success in all ways. My sub-committee work tirelessly on this day to ensure all went well.

Emerald Lakes Golf Club was our fifth event with another strong field for the day with 136 playing an Irish Four Ball, again this event venue is superb value for money at \$35.00 for Emerald Lakes members & \$65.00 for the rest of the field.

Our final event for the year was held at Sanctuary Cove on the 21<sup>st</sup> November with a field of 148 members. With a price tag of only \$75.00 per player this event sold out within 24 hours!!!. The Ambrose flowed smoothly even with the high number in the field. Lunch was of a Christmas flavour with the tables dressed accordingly for the day. A lot of laughs were had with our special guest 'Vera'. This event was a great way to finish such a great successful year.

These games could not have gone so smoothly if not for the efforts and support from the sub-committee members of Christine Brierley who helped tirelessly throughout the season, Di Gidney who organised the raffle tickets and sold them with the much help of Vivian Ashton. I thank you all so much!

The raffles have been such a huge part of our events with table always full of wine, chocolates and other goodies. The money raised is always returned back to the Vet members and this year our surplus of funds went into a gift bag of Chocolates and Champagne to each player at our Christmas event held at Sanctuary Cove. I would also like to thank Clare Kirby's mother for her kind donations throughout the last two years.

Success to the Chair of Vet and sub-committee is based on the increase of numbers with our ladies that have joined the Veteran's during the 2016 season and the comradery that is shown and experienced at each event.

It certainly has been a very rewarding year for me personally and I thank everyone for the support that you have given.

#### **2016 JUNIOR REPORT**

Jan Edgar and myself took on the role of joint Junior Co-ordinators a year ago and have worked well together.

We re-established the Nicole Lowein trophy series, which was a points system over 7 nominated tournaments on the Coast. The first three tournaments were well supported with some excellent scores, but then due to scheduling issues this faded away to sometimes only 3 entries. We are endeavouring to try this format again this year in conjunction with the Men's District and Junior Golf Queensland.

We had a very successful Junior Jug in Gatton in July. Despite extreme weather conditions, and challenging accommodation, our girls performed very well to finish a credible 2nd. We will again be trialling for this year's team and hope to travel to Cairns in July with the winning team!

Highlights of the year have been the emergence of Isabelle Taylor from Sanctuary Cove who has performed both locally, nationally and Internationally.

Becky Kay came 3<sup>rd</sup> in the RACV Gold Coat Challenge in February this year.

Lisa Edgar, Becky Kay and Karis Davidson were members of the Qld Junior State team that finished runners up by 1/2 point at Nationals in Tasmania.

Isabelle Taylor and Lion Higo were part of the winning Qld State Schools team that won the national title in South Australia.

Lion Higo and Karen Kim were selected to represent Qld in the State of Origin team.

The Junior District championships were held in August at Southport and won by Maddie Trew.

The Junior Girls are in a real transition stage with a number of our Elite girls moving into the open women's events. Becky Kay, Karis Davidson, and Robyn Choi have already moved on, with Lisa Edgar joining them in June.

We now have a major focus on developing, nurturing and maintaining junior girls in golf on the gold coast. Some clubs on the GC have embraced the Golf Australia 'My Golf' programme. As this is aimed at the 8-12 year age group, we anticipate it will take 2-3 years before we see the benefits flowing through to increased numbers of Junior Girls.

Jan and I recently attended a full day Golf Queensland workshop in Brisbane for Junior Coordinators from throughout Queensland. A lot of discussion was how we can increase the number of juniors by promoting and advertising programs such as My Golf. This was very worthwhile workshop and Golf Queensland is hoping to hold this workshop annually.

We have finally been able to initiate Junior Pennant for the girls either before or after the business ladies on Sundays. The girls are playing individually and matches are with handicap difference. We had 11 girls participate in the first round and for some this was their first experience of match play. Please make these girls feel welcome, 3 of them are only 10 and we are hoping this is a beginning to a lifetime in the sport.

#### **2016 QLD DELEGATES REPORT**

#### **GOLF QUEENSLAND'S GUIDING PRINCIPLES:**

All our decisions will be defined by the following principles: • Driving innovation while respecting tradition • Proactive industry leadership • Cooperation via effective communication • State-wide delivery of services "If it is Good for Golf in Queensland then it is Good for Golf Queensland"

Priorities for Growth in the Development of Golf:

- 1. Growth of junior programs and junior participation My Golf Casual Player (Engagement)
- Junior Development Programs, Events, State/High Performance Teams
- 2. Increased participation Casual Player Offerings Retention Strategies for existing club members Female membership and participation programs "Ladies Let's Golf"
- 3. Improved club planning and performance Club support and development program
- 4. Increase revenue from sponsorship and donations. (QLD Golf Foundation)

#### Affiliation Fee Collection:

Some districts have trouble getting clubs to pay on time and to report correct membership numbers. This can be difficult, stressful and/or time consuming for district volunteers who would rather be focusing on golf operations. • Some clubs do not know the capitation fees to collect from members at the start of their respective financial years as they are yet to be announced by GQ and GA. • There have been instances where districts have advised clubs of the incorrect GQ fee which has resulted in tension and problems with collection. • 159 clubs are part of both a men's district and a women's district. This requires the club to pay the GQ fee to two separate districts (often at different times) before being passed through to GQ. • There is no database of player information, which can be used by the district, GQ & GA

GQ believes that the goal of achieving a more "equitable, efficient and effective" capitation fee system could be achieved with two key changes: • GQ collect the GQ & GA capitation fees directly from clubs. • Consistent dates for member reporting and capitation fee collection be adopted across all districts. GQ would also be willing to collect the district fees and then pass them down to the district. This would be at the discretion of each district.

Districts can focus less on administration/debt collection and more on growing the game and running programs & events. • GQ will have experienced staff responsible for the reporting and collection process (and this forms part of their position description). • GQ will have better access to GolfLink to review clubs who may be providing incorrect membership information. • In creating a consistent date for member reporting and capitation fee collection, we can eliminate the problem of clubs collecting from members prior to the fees being announced by GQ and GA.

Feedback would be sought at the District Council meeting in May 2017 and if districts believe it's worth pursuing, GQ can then look at necessary changes to the constitution, deed of agreement and capitation fee by-law.

#### FYI:

Golf WA – full 2016 fee is \$34.43 (including GST). • Golf SA – full 2017 fee is \$34.20 (including GST). • Golf Vic – full 2016 fee \$47.90 (including GST). • Golf NSW – full 2016 fee \$30.50 (including GST). • Golf QLD – full 2017 fee is \$31.25 (including GST).

The 2018 capitation fee will be \$32.80 (including GST). For clarity, this is the fee that will be paid by districts to Golf Queensland by 31 May 2018.

2016 has seen the implementation of the **Golf Queensland Foundation**. The Foundation goals are simple:

- Increase participation in the game of golf
- Grow and promote the game and the industry in Queensland
- Raise funds to invest in the future of the game
- The Foundation will focus on three key areas in order to build stronger golfing communities:

**Junior Participation** - help juniors enjoy their game and teach skills that will be used both on and off the course, for life.

#### WHY

- There is a need to work collaboratively to support junior golf
- Lack of resources to deliver statewide programs
- The need to increase the golf footprint across the state
- To assist mentoring of deliverers
- Grow grassroots participation

#### HOW

- Promote the game and its benefits including health and social wellbeing
- Delivery of statewide programs with resources

**Female Participation** - to engage, attract and retain new participants or existing female golfers by providing clear pathways for their enjoyment while improving their golf skills.

#### WHY

- A need to increase female specific programs
- Lack of resources to deliver statewide programs
- To assist mentoring of deliverers
- Grow female participation and club membership

#### HOW

- Entice, introduce, increase and retain people to golf club/facilities through clinic participation
- Provide a culture and experience that is welcoming, motivating, inclusive and supportive of every player.
- Implement new strategies to encourage continued participation and retention of golfers within the club landscape
- Provide a clear pathway for female participation and membership

Club and District Support - to provide support and guidance to golf clubs and districts.

#### WHY

- Decline in the numbers of clubs
- Decline in the club membership numbers
- Increase in the number of clubs under financial stress.
- Lack of resources to deliver statewide programs
- To assist mentoring of deliverers

#### HOW

- To secure the future of our golf clubs and districts by supporting them to achieve a sustainable business practice
- Delivery of statewide programs with resources
